# **Annual Report 2014**



## Message from the Director

Dear Friends,

The great majority of kittens adopted from our organization now come from outside of Larimer County. To be in a position to be able to take in cats and kittens from other shelters where death is otherwise imminent is a fortunate position to be in, and not one that many organizations can boast about. The feeling of relief to know these lives that hung in peril are now safe

extends well beyond our group. It is felt by those shelter workers and volunteers who are fighting tirelessly in what feels like an uphill battle. It is felt by the foster homes that provide love and nourishment while an uncertain fate hangs in their foster kitties' future. And of course it is felt by the animals themselves.

In our 2009 Annual Report our organization reported taking 876 stray and surrendered cats into our shelter from our community — this was 90% of our total intakes. Only 41 cats and kittens were transferred in from other shelters and rescues. Now fast forward to 2014. In 2014 we transferred in 1,003 kittens and adult cats from other shelters and rescues (almost 50%), nearly all of which came from outside of Larimer County. What does this mean?

I consider this shift in numbers proof of programs that work — programs that address the roots of pet homelessness. Providing services like free and low-cost spay/neuter to prevent unwanted puppies and kittens from being born; free and low-cost basic veterinary services so at-risk pets

stay healthy and in their homes; free pet food when someone has hit hard times and is willing to accept help to keep their four-legged family member out of a shelter; and spay/neuter and other medical care to community cats so they can continue to live without reproducing or spreading illness. The work that we have been doing in Northern Colorado to improve animal welfare has been tremendous, and the effects are really starting to be seen. Evidence of which is that the population of homeless kittens in our community is nearing non-existence.

Our community used to be one in which healthy, adoptable kittens were at times euthanized due to lack of space in the local shelter. The worst of our uphill battle has been fought and won, and we have you to thank for that. We are fortunate to be able to whisper to cats and kittens upon their arrival, "You are at Fort Collins Cat Rescue &

Spay/Neuter Clinic. You are safe."

## **Our Mission**

Fort Collins Cat Rescue & Spay/Neuter Clinic is dedicated to the well-being of all cats and dogs in our community with emphasis on preventing pet overpopulation and on the sheltering and placement of surrendered or abandoned cats into loving, permanent homes.





## **Our History**

Fort Collins Cat Rescue & Spay/Neuter Clinic is a cutting edge animal welfare organization that offers multiple programs and services to keep companion animals in homes and out of shelters, while also providing shelter and adoptions for homeless cats and kittens. The Cat Rescue was founded in June 2006 by two veterinary technicians who saw a need in the community for a cat-focused rescue, as unwanted cats were being euthanized at a higher rate than dogs at the local humane society. The Spay/Neuter Clinic was launched in March 2007 to address the root cause of euthanasia in the region: pet overpopulation. By the end of 2014, the shelter had found homes for more than **7,900** cats, and the clinic had performed nearly **32,000** surgeries on dogs and cats since inception.

## **Cat Shelter Services**

Our adoption-guarantee shelter accepts surrendered and homeless felines. All cats are provided with preventative health measures, microchipped and spayed/neutered prior to adoption.

### Foster Program

Our 140 foster homes cared for more than 1,540

**kittens and cats** in 2014. Of all the felines that entered our care, 73% spent some time in foster. Up to 181 cats and kittens at any one time were housed in our extensive network of foster homes.

Fosters logged a total of **25,254 volunteer hours** for the year (one kitten requires an average of one hour of care per day).


Poudre Pet & Feed Supply keeps all of FCCRSNC's shelter kitties fed with weekly deliveries of



cat food — an annual in-kind donation valued at **over \$30,000**. They also collect UPC symbols for Natural Balance Pet Foods' rebate program, which helps fund PAL+.

# Collaborating Coast to Coast

There has been a significant decrease in the number of homeless kittens in Northern Colorado due to increased spay/



19 agencies from across seven states, including Colorado, transferred 1,003 felines to our shelter:

256 from within Colorado, 276 California, 223 Texas, 163 Georgia, 35 Kansas, 30 New Mexico, and 20 from Wyoming



# Off-Site & Mobile Adoptions

Over **40% of adoptions** in 2014 occurred at off-site adoption locations or mobile adoption events.

FCCRSNC partnered with several businesses that sheltered cats in their stores or hosted us during weekend adoption events. Our mobile adoptions program increased our visibility in the community and helped to grow total adoptions by 72% over 2013.

# ASPCA & Subaru "Share the Love"

Our shelter was awarded a \$10,000 grant to participate in the ASPCA & Subaru "Share the Love" Rescue Ride event — one of only 19 animal welfare groups nationwide to receive the honor.

The grant's purpose was to fund the safe transport of sheltered cats from localities where supply exceeds demand to areas where demand outpaces the supply of adoptable pets.

The first of four approved Rescue Rides occurred on Dec. 16 and involved 42 cats transported from New Beginnings for Merced County Animals in Winton, Calif.



## **Spay/Neuter & Vaccination Clinic Services**



Our low-cost clinic targets low-income pet owners, students, the elderly, and other animal rescue organizations, but it is fully open to the general public. We offer weekly low-cost vaccine clinics, microchipping, FeLV/FIV testing, de-worming, and heartworm testing and prevention.

## **PetSmart Charities Spay/Neuter Blitzes**



Thanks to a \$32,020 grant from PetSmart Charities, our clinic was able to participate for a third year in their national spay/neuter campaigns. New for 2014, Happy Neuter Year was added to the lineup,

targeting only male pets. Each month-long promotion focused on specific species, age, sex or even breed (such as "Primp Your Pit") to help reduce pet overpopulation.

## **Community Cat Program**

In May 2014 we instituted our Community Cat Program with a dedicated staff member to respond to calls for assistance with stray, feral and community cats. We not only traveled to sites to perform trapneuter-return (TNR), but sometimes also



delivered kibble to struggling pet owners or colony caretakers, or transported pets to our clinic for surgery or vaccinations.

The Community Cat Program serves to overcome barriers for pet owners who need our services by going the extra mile to ensure animals are in their best possible environments and to create the best chance for a positive outcome.

## Prevent A Litter Plus (PAL+)





Our PAL+ program receives thousands of dollars each year from Natural Balance Pet Foods' rebates. Event sponsorships and rebate funding from Natural Balance, one of our Hero level Shelter Advocates, totaled \$17,139.50 in 2014. Our shelter cats are also fed Natural Balance cat food, donated by Poudre

## **Kibble Supply Pet Food Pantry**



Our Kibble Supply program works in conjunction with Prevent A Litter Plus to help provide basic care services that enable pets to remain with their families.

Kibble Supply participants may receive food for three consecutive months in the calendar year before proof of low income is required.

They also must have their pets spayed or neutered and are referred to the PAL+ program for assistance if needed.

## **Volunteer Program**

A team of 427 active volunteers and 30 one-time helpers were involved in every program we offer. Volunteers assisted with shelter cat care and spay/neuter surgery days at the clinic, fostered, distributed kibble, and staffed mobile adoption, outreach and fundraising events. Volunteer hours spent working in the clinic grew 66.3% over last year, due to both increased surgery and vaccination clinic days and to improved time tracking.

## **Saving Pets Challenge**

In just 32 days, between Sept. 29 and Oct. 30, 2014, generous supporters and donors helped FCCRSNC raise a total of \$51,725 through the first-ever Saving Pets Challenge. This nation-wide online fundraising campaign was launched by Michelson Found Animals Foundation to benefit organizations focused on reducing shelter euthanasia. FCCRSNC placed 5th in the nation, earning \$6,625 in grant prizes. The online crowdfunding campaign garnered 740 individual contributions from 511 donors.



Supporters were encouraged to raise money on our behalf in exchange for incentive prizes, and we built a fundraising team of 61 members, including three local businesses: Caffé Olé, Six Dog T-Shirt Co., and Four Seasons Veterinary Specialists.




