


2015 Community Impact Report



Message from the Director

Dear Friends.

2015 was another year of record-breaking, life-saving results for Fort Collins Cat Rescue & Spay/Neuter Clinic. In just 365 days, 2,224 homeless cats and kittens found a fresh-start thanks to our Shelter & Adoptions Program, and over 6,162 cats and dogs were sterilized through our high-volume spay/neuter clinic.

Additionally, our organization hosted its first-ever Healthy Pets Clinic in a low-income neighborhood in our community where many at-risk pets can be found. This Healthy Pets Clinic was the first of what we hope will be many in a series of



hugely impactful clinics. For a half day in July we offered free vaccinations and supplies to pet owners in this targeted community. We also gave out vouchers for free spay/neuter on any

unaltered pets seen during that time (and also for any other pets in the family who weren't seen that day). We saw an incredible 153 animals, and gave out 76 spay/neuter vouchers

in *only four hours!* We followed up the event with free transportation for those unaltered pets to and from our spay/ neuter clinic.

One of the things that I love most about our organization is our continual effort to review our programs and services to ensure the largest impact. We added our Healthy Pets Clinics to further our efforts of keeping



pets in loving homes and out of shelters, while still increasing the number of homeless cats that we could help in our adoption-guarantee shelter – ensuring that although we added to our services, we did not remove any focus from our founding belief that every homeless cat should have a safe place to go.

The work we perform is so important, and we thank our community for its generosity in 2015!

Our Mission



Fort Collins Cat Rescue & Spay/ Neuter Clinic is dedicated to the well-being of all cats and dogs in our community with emphasis on preventing pet overpopulation and on the sheltering and placement of surrendered or abandoned cats into loving, permanent homes.

Our History



Fort Collins Cat Rescue & Spay/Neuter Clinic is a cutting edge animal welfare organization that offers multiple programs and services to keep companion animals in homes and out of shelters, while also providing shelter and adoptions for homeless cats and kittens. The Cat Rescue was founded in June 2006 by two veterinary technicians who saw a need in the community for a cat-focused rescue, as unwanted cats were being euthanized at a higher rate than dogs at the local humane society. The Spay/Neuter Clinic was launched in March 2007 to address the root cause of euthanasia in the region: pet overpopulation. By the end of 2015, the shelter had found homes for more than **10,100** cats, and the clinic had performed over **38,100** surgeries on dogs and cats since inception.

Cat Shelter Services

Our adoption-guarantee shelter accepts surrendered and homeless felines. All cats are provided with preventative health measures, microchipped and spayed/neutered prior to adoption.

In December 2015, our shelter adopted out our 10,000th kitty, pictured far right, marking 10,000 lives saved in under 10 years.

Outcomes



Foster Program



A total of 1,492 kittens and cats were fostered by 183 volunteers in 2015. Of all the felines that entered our care, 62% spent some time in foster. At the peak of summer kitten season, there were 243 cats and kittens being housed in our extensive network of foster homes.

Foster volunteers logged a total of 34,067 volunteer hours for the year, 39% more than in 2014 (a single kitten requires an average of one hour of care per day).

Poudre Pet & Feed Supply keeps all of FCCRSNC's shelter kitties fed with weekly deliveries of cat food an annual in-kind donation valued at **over \$31,000**. They also collect UPC symbols for Natural Balance Pet Foods' rebate program, which helps fund the PAL+ program.

Off-Site & Mobile Adoptions

Nearly 50% of adoptions in 2015 occurred at off-site adoption locations or mobile adoption events. FCCRSNC partnered with several businesses that sheltered cats in their stores or hosted us during weekend adoption events, helping to grow adoptions by 14% over 2014.

We began making several improvements to our mobile adoptions program thanks to a

\$44,000 grant from PetSmart Charities, which allowed us to purchase tablets, printers and Wi-Fi hot spots as well as new wire crates and marketing.

We adopted out a record 823 felines from the Fort Collins PetSmart store, including 390 from the store's cat adoption room. The remaining 433 were adopted during weekend mobile adoption events at the store.



Saving Lives Nationwide

There were 33 agencies from across 11 states

Dakota, Nebraska and Nevada,

that transferred 1,169 felines to our shelter, including 395 from other Colorado rescues. The remainder (in order from greatest to least number of cats transported) were from: Texas, Georgia, Wyoming, New Mexico, California, Oklahoma, Kansas, South

Clicker-Training Partnership

We partnered with a new local organization called Clicker Learning Institute for Cats & Kittens (CLICK) that is researching whether clicker training helps increase adoption rates and decrease length of stay for shelter cats.

CLICK, located in the same building as our facility, housed up to 10 of our adult shelter cats on two-week training rotations. During their stay, the kitties received daily clicker or target training. The sessions were beneficial for shy cats to overcome a fear of being touched, or for hyperactive cats to engage their problem-solving skills. Cats needing longer than two weeks to resolve more severe behavior issues were afforded additional time.



Spay/Neuter & Vaccination Clinic Services

Our low-cost clinic targets low-income pet owners, students, the elderly, and other animal rescue organizations, but it is fully open to the general public. We offer weekly low-cost vaccine clinics, microchipping, FeLV/ FIV testing, de-worming, and heartworm testing and prevention.

New for 2015, Community Cats was added to the lineup. and Cherish Your Chihuahua replaced the Primp Your Pit Thanks to a grant from (Bull) campaign. To fill the PetSmart Charities, our clinic void for pit bull parents in need of a discount, we joined fourth year in their national forces with our local humane society (see right for details).



Pit Fix Collaboration

In December 2015, we partnered with Larimer Humane Society to provide \$20 spay/neuter for 58 pit bull and pit **bull mix dogs**, one of the most highly euthanized dog breeds in the nation.

Community Cat Program

Our Community Cat Program received a \$70,000, two-year grant from PetSmart Charities to spay or neuter 1,400 free-roaming cats in the 80537 and 80538 zip codes in Loveland.

This funding enabled us to dedicate a staff member full time to the program, responding to calls for assistance with stray, feral and community cats. We not only traveled to sites to



perform trap-neuterreturn (TNR), but sometimes also delivered kibble to struggling pet owners or colony caretakers, or transported pets to our clinic for surgery or vaccinations.

Pet Retention Services

Every person wants the best for their four-legged family members, but for those struggling to make ends meet, affording vaccinations and spay/neuter can be nearly impossible. We do not want people to be in a situation where they must consider surrendering their pets to a shelter if we are in a position to prevent it.

Prevent A Litter Plus (PAL+)

The PAL+ program provided free spay/neuter and discounted vaccinations and microchips to pets of Larimer and Weld County pet owners who showed financial need through proof of low income or government assistance.



Healthy Pets Clinic

On July 19 we held our first-ever Healthy Pets Clinic and provided free basic vaccinations and supplies to **107 dogs** and **46 cats** in a Loveland neighborhood with a significant population of financially constrained pet owners. Of the 68 unaltered pets in attendance, we spayed/neutered 48 at our clinic in the days that followed, including a pit bull who had already birthed 30 puppies!

Natural Balance PET FOODS, INC.

Our Prevent A Litter Plus (PAL+) program receives thousands of dollars each year from Natural Balance Pet Foods' rebates. Event sponsorships and rebate funding from Natural Balance, one of our Hero level Shelter Advocates, totaled over **\$26,000** in 2015. Our shelter cats are also fed Natural Balance cat food, donated by Poudre Pet & Feed Supply.

Kibble Supply Pet Food Pantry

Our Kibble Supply program works in conjunction with PAL+ to help provide basic care that enables pets to remain with their families. Participants may receive food for 3 consecutive months in a calendar year before proof of low income is required. They also must spay/neuter their pets and are referred to PAL+ for assistance if needed.

Volunteer Program



A team of **475 active volunteers** and 98 one-time helpers were involved in every program we offer. Volunteer hours **grew 23.6%** over last year, with increased opportunities for

volunteers to help with trap-neuter-return, animal transport, mobile adoptions, and medical care for the shelter cats. Volunteers also assisted with spay/neuter surgery days at the clinic, fostered, distributed kibble, and staffed fundraising events.




