BRINGING PAWS TOGETHER BUILDING BEGINS!

Have you seen the changes at our Taft Hill Campus? Animal Friends Alliance is expanding to help even more cats, dogs, and the families who love them — and construction is finally starting! Our capital campaign, Bringing Paws Together, launched in March of 2021 to unify our sheltering and adoptions programs at our Taft Hill Campus, provide even better care for the animals in our shelters, and continue to grow our Community Pet Resource programs that keep dogs and cats in their loving homes.

Bringing Paws Together is adding a completely new building to our Taft Hill Campus, which will house a new central lobby, our new cat adoption space, an Enrichment

Center for improved dog training programs, and community spaces to welcome members of the public to Animal Friends Alliance. We will also renovate the long-unused building on the west side of the property, converting the space to our new intake facility, cat care, and staff offices that will allow us to consolidate our adoption team and work even more effectively. The exisiting dog shelter building will also undergo renovations to improve efficiency in caring for our shelter animals.

Animal Friends Alliance has been working closely with VFLA Architecture + Interiors and contractors Saunders Heath as the building plans have been finalized

CAMPAIGN FEATURE: CAT COLONY ROOMS

Our new building will feature 11 cat colony rooms housing up to 5 cats. These give the adoptable cats a cage-free living environment while also providing a welcoming, home-like atmosphere for potential adopters to meet their new family member. Each room will have plenty of climbing and hiding spots plus windows for people-watching.



The "tree" inside colony room 10 will provide enrichment for the cat residents and a decorative focal point in our lobby.

and construction has begun. As with many construction projects, there have been unexpected changes along the way. The projected cost of construction has increased by half a million dollars since the campaign launched in early 2021. As our plans progressed, we found that we needed to add important, but costly, upgrades like a new roof on the existing building we are renovating, a new water line, an expansion to the septic system, and a fire mitigation sprinkler system and fire access road. Construction costs in general have also increased dramatically since the project began.

Despite these challenges, we are more than 72% of the way to our \$2.8 million goal and the first phase of construction has begun. "It's incredibly exciting to see the changes happening at our Taft Hill Campus," says Executive Director Sarah Swanty, "After so many months of planning and preparation, our dream of a space designed with the animals, and the community, in mind is finally coming to life." The new facility is projected to be

completed in November of this year.

After the new facility is completed, all sheltering and adoptions will take place at our Taft Hill Campus. Our Mulberry Campus will remain the hub of all our Community Pet Resource programs, including our subsidized Spay/Neuter Clinic, Prevent a Litter Plus program, Community Cat Program, and Kibble Supply Pet Food Pantry. The extra space will allow us to one day expand these programs to meet the growing need for supportive services in our community.

Dog Quarantine and **Isolation Kennels**

Twenty-two dog kennels in three separate rooms in our veterinary building house newly arrived dogs and dogs receiving medical care.



MARDI PAW: LETTING THE GOOD TIMES ROLL

This year Animal Friends Alliance got to celebrate another major milestone - our first in-person Gala for Animals! This year our theme was Mardi Paw and we went all-out getting into the New Orleans spirit. The event, our largest fundrasier of the year, netted over \$175,000 on March 26 to help support our cat and dog shelters and Community Pet Resource programs. Nearly 420 guests and over 50 volunteers were in attendance at Mardi Paw, held at the Hilton Fort Collins Hotel.

Mardi Paw featured a live auction called by Dani Dotterosa and speeches by Animal Friends Alliance board members Kris Cafaro and Jana Dean, DVM, as well as Co-Founder Ali Eccleston, and Co-Founder and Executive Director Sarah Swanty. During the program, Swanty welcomed a special guest to the stage: Tsuki, a pointer mix who received specialized medical care during her stay with Animal Friends Alliance in early 2022. The Gala for Animals raises funds for Animal Friends Alliance's shelters, including medical treatment for the cats and dogs in its care, and Community Pet Resource programs to keep pets in their homes.

Generous businesses and individuals donated hundreds of items to make the Gala for Animals. silent and live auctions a success. With a record number of guests and mobile bidding allowing supporters

to participate from anywhere, the silent auction raised over \$37,360 for Animal Friends Alliance, a new record. More than 20 artists also donated their talents to create the crowd-favorite Magnificent Beast art pieces, cat- or dog-shaped wooden silhouettes, which dazzled guests and led to competitive bidding through the silent auction.

Two businesses and two individuals were honored with 2022 Above & Beyond Awards for their exceptional commitment and dedication to the organization. The business winners were Horizon Mechanical Solutions and Autumn

Animal Friends Alliance staff were also recognized for their exceptional contributions in the last year. Two staff members receive Saving P.A.W.S. awards in each of the four areas of People (teamwork, support, attitude), Animals (efforts to help the animals), Work Ethic (punctuality, hard work, attendance), and Society (representing the organization positively) as well as two overall Grand Champions. our Grand Champions were Taft Hill Shelter Veterinarian John Marsella and Adoption Program Manager Sarah Jenkner.

Since our founding in 2006, Animal Friends Alliance has grown to employ over 60 staff members and has an annual operating budget of \$3.5 million. The annual Gala for Animals plays an important role in supporting our services and mission to provide comprehensive companion animal resources, services, and education to the community to prevent homelessness and promote the human-animal bond.

"We are so proud of this fantastic event that will enable us to help

even more animals and people in our community," said Executive Director Sarah Swantv. "Mardi Paw would not have been as successful as it was without the support of our 34 amazing sponsors, including our presenting sponsors Poudre Pet & Feed Supply, Avoderm, and Natural Balance Pet Foods."
